Overview of the school:

Pupil Premium

Pupil Premium is a designated amount of money that the government allocates to each school, based upon a number of factors which are linked to the perceived deprivation of certain pupils in school. This money is spent directly or indirectly on those pupils who are considered vulnerable because they are not meeting National Expectations in terms of attainment.

Principles

Pupil Premium is allocated to children who are known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), Service Children, Post LAC and Early Years PP. We are required to publish online information about how we have used the grant. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the grant and the extra support that they receive.
